BEN CAVALLO



Currently serving as Board Chair, Ben Cavallo's relationship with Horizons started when a DCD family invited Ben and his wife, Ange, to the 10th Anniversary gala, and they have been involved with Horizons ever since. You might say it's a family affair, as Ange serves as Director of Development for Horizons at DCD.

Ben's philanthropic mindset was instilled in him by his father and his deep commitment to community and service. Ben grew up in Mansfield, MA, and graduated from Xaverian Brothers High School and Emory University before receiving an MBA from Boston College. Ben serves as President of Cavallo and Signiorello Insurance Agency in Mansfield and he lives in Dedham with Ange and their two children, Ellie and Sam. We recently sat down with Ben to learn more about what brought him to his seat as Board Chair, his proudest accomplishments in the role, and what excites him about the future of Horizons at Dedham Country Day.

Who has most inspired you to be the person you are today?

My father. He was an incredibly kind and generous man whose story inspires me every day. My father's parents moved to the United States from Italy just a few years before my dad was born. Unfortunately, they moved to the United States as the Great Depression was just beginning. With few marketable skills, limited understanding of the English language, and an imploding economy, his parents found it hard to find steady employment. When my father was 15, my grandfather suddenly passed away. It was at that moment that my father made a commitment to take care of his family. He lied about his age and enrolled in the Army during WWII. The Army gave my family a steady paycheck, but it also gave him access to college through the GI Bill. Education was the key for my dad—it opened doors that were unimaginable prior to enrolling in college. He went on to earn two degrees, one from Northeastern and the other from Bentley. He started his own insurance business and had an incredibly successful career. Today, I run the same business my father started in 1959.

What life skills do you draw on to excel as Board Chair?

It is a team effort. I think we all would agree that we are stronger when we work together, and I am 100% positive that our board and the employees of Horizons would say that we are a terrific team. I am blessed to work with an incredible group of dedicated, passionate, committed, and generous individuals. I am just there to make sure we are moving in the same direction.





What led you to Horizons at Dedham Country Day School?

My wife, Ange, and I attended our first Horizons event about 9 years ago. We were invited by another DCD family, and we have been to every gala since. The mission of the program was inspiring and it really resonated with my family's story. After attending a few events, they asked Ange to be on the board. When she told me, I asked her if she would let me do it instead. I know firsthand how access to education can change a person's life, and I wanted to contribute to that mission.

What results have you seen as students graduate from Horizons?

In general, I would say that the most inspirational moments are when you see a student jump with excitement when he is given the Love of Reading award at graduation. It is the look of excitement when

you hear a student say they first picked up a musical instrument at Horizons and now they are playing in the high school band. Or when a graduate says he tried out for the school play because Horizons challenged him to get out of his comfort zone. These small moments are when you realize a program like Horizons can make a difference.

What is the number one thing that you are proud of in your role as Board Chair?

I am proud that we have continued the vision of our founder, Gita Iyer, who was the chair of this program for 10+ years. To say that she is a tough act to follow is an understatement. While we can never fill her shoes, I am tremendously proud that we were able to come together as a team and keep our program moving forward.

What is on the horizon for Horizons?

It has been an honor to serve as Board Chair, and I am excited to pass the baton to our next Chair, Lisa Mims, in 2024. I will be sad to step down, but building an organization that can succeed for years to come was my main goal. Creating a decision-making team and empowering others to lead in their own way is imperative for our continued success, and I know Lisa will do an incredible job. No one has done more to get people involved in our program than Lisa has, and our board is lucky to have her leadership.

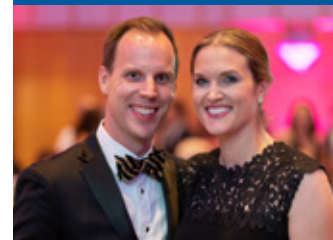
NEW BOARD MEMBERS

I am excited to help out more myself, but also to get my children involved and to introduce my family and friends to the program."

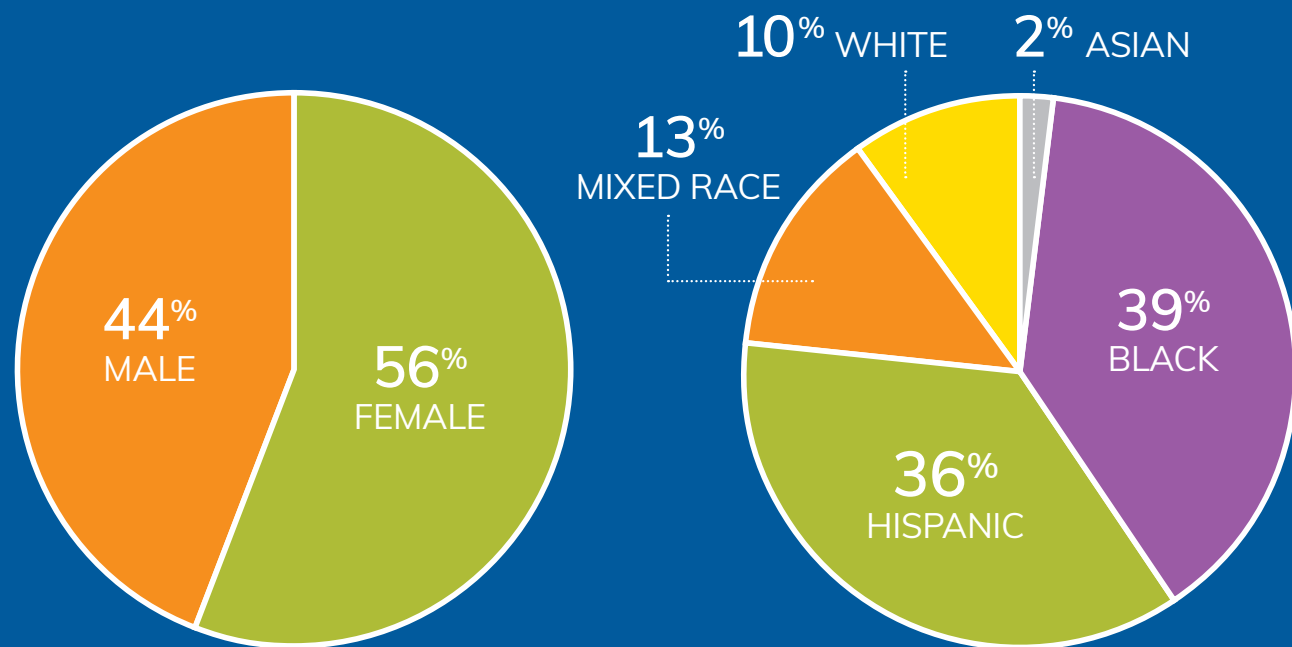

Summer Demographics

Currently, Horizons at DCD serves **143 Pre-K through 8th grade** students in Boston and Dedham annually. 29 of the students live in Dedham, while 114 live in the Boston metro area.

Horizons Innovates

Science Technology Engineering Arts and Math (STEAM) Specialist

In 2023, Horizons hired a dedicated STEAM Specialist to provide additional hands-on, project-based learning opportunities for our lower school Scholars.

Some Horizons classes witnessed the metamorphosis of caterpillars transforming into butterflies. Other classes learned about the scarcity of clean water around the planet and built filtration systems to increase access to clean water.

Positive Behavior Incentive System (PBIS) and Horizons Credits

To accompany our theme of “Belonging,” Horizons introduced a positive behavior incentive system. Students earned “Horizons Credits” by exhibiting one of our core pillars: Respect, Effort, Kindness, and Responsibility.

At the end of the week, Scholars had the opportunity to cash in their Horizons Credits for prizes at the School Store. Scholars could choose between a small prize for that week, or they could save their credits for a larger prize at the end of the summer. Students even had the choice to pool their credits for an extra class field trip or pizza party!

Through PBIS, Horizons teachers rewarded the many examples of positive behavior taking place on campus, and students quickly caught on!

Starfish Aquatics Institute - Updated Swim Curriculum

In 2023, Horizons partnered with the Starfish Aquatics Institute to train our certified swim instructors and provide an engaging curriculum for Horizons students. As a result, we successfully certified 11 swim instructors and gave them the appropriate skills to teach swimming.

Our new swim curriculum was designed to keep students engaged while teaching the basics of swim safety for our new swimmers and proficient strokes for our more advanced students.

Increased Extracurriculars

By summer 2023, Horizons introduced three new extracurricular activities to our existing 10. Bike Club, Cosmetology, and Woodshop all premiered and were a hit!

Scholars in the Biking Club had the opportunity to learn to ride a bike and eventually safely cycle around Dedham. Scholars in Cosmetology studied and learned beauty techniques as well as new ways to incorporate self-care practices at home. Woodshop was available to all grades, and students completed many projects such as, name plates, puzzles, and coasters.

“Three Middle School students learned how to ride a bike this summer during our bike program. Helping them develop this lifelong skill was my favorite part of the summer.”

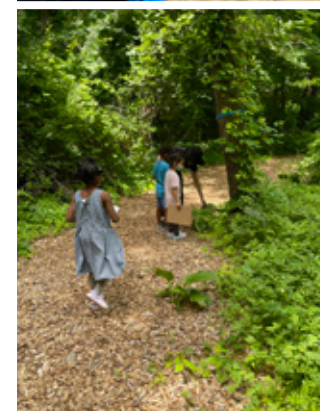
HORIZONS VOLUNTEER

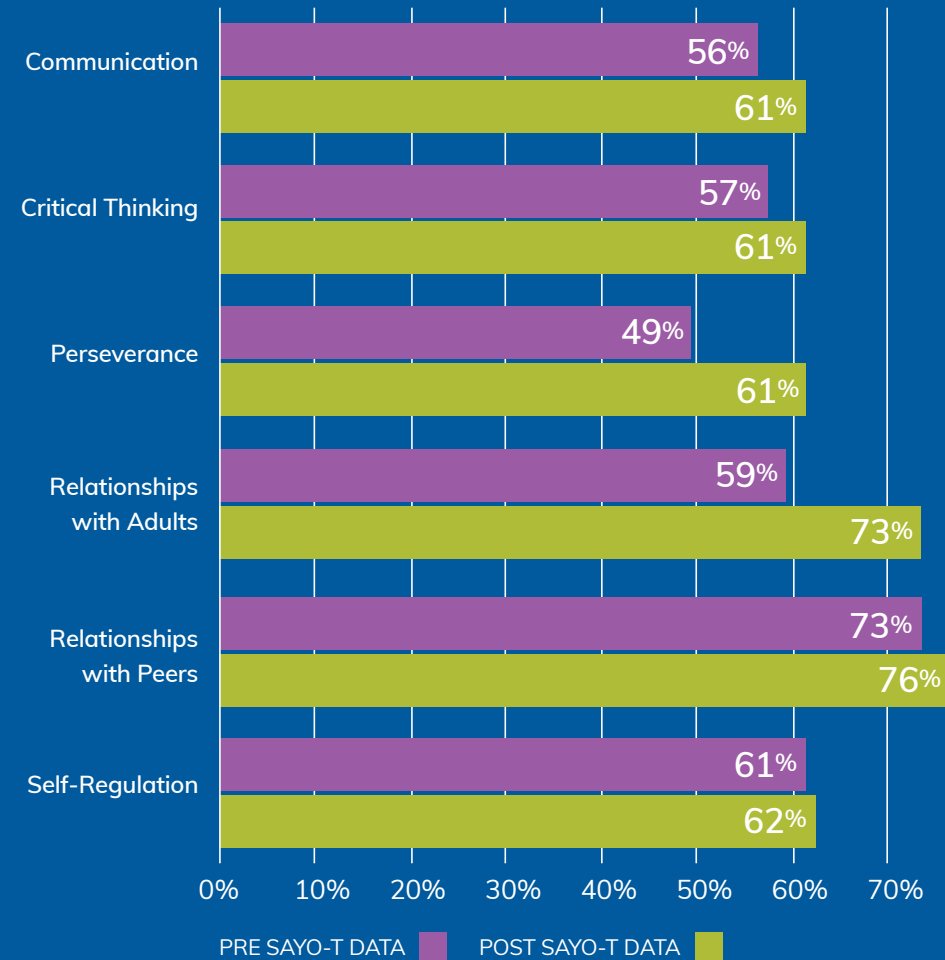
